- United States House of Representatives
 - > 221 213
- United States Senate
 - ▶ 50 50
 - Democratic-control w/Vice President tie breaker
- National Labor Relations Board
 - 3-2 Democrat majority
 - Reverse Trump decisions (Ex. Joint employer)



- Department of Labor
 - Marty Walsh, Secretary
 - First union member to serve in over 40 years
- Advisory Committee on Apprenticeship
 - IEC Member: Tim Oberg, IEC Indy A&T Director (2 yr. appointment)
 - Membership: 1/3 labor, 1/3 public, 1/3 employer
 - Subcommittees:
 - Pre-Apprenticeship, Youth Apprenticeship, Degree Apprenticeships
 - Industry Engagement in New & Emergency Sectors
 - Increasing Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Accessibility
 - Apprenticeship Modernization



- White House Task Force on Worker Organizing and Empowerment
 - Vice President & Sec. of Labor
 - "Dedicated to mobilizing the federal government's policies, programs, and practices to empower workers to organize and successfully bargain with their employers"
 - Guidelines to increase unions in the federal workforce released



- National Apprenticeship Act
 - House-passed, Pending in Senate
 - IEC-opposed
 - Union-only grant funding
 - Codifies the union ratio carve out

Protecting the Right to Organize (PRO) Act

- House passed, Pending in Senate
- Schumer 50 Cosponsor threshold
 - Sens. Sinema, Kelly, Warner
- Public Relations Effort



- "Back Door" Project Labor Agreements (PLAs)
 - Pay Davis-Bacon wages & Registered Apprenticeship Requirements
 - ▶ 15% of Laborer Hours
 - ▶ 4 Laborers 1 Must be a Registered Apprentice
 - Private sector business deals/tax incentives ("bonus" tax incentive)
 - Senate Clean Energy Bill
 - ► Reconciliation
 - Federal grant funding
 - INVEST Act
 - House NDAA
- "Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Training Program"
 - Rep. Donald Norcross (D-NJ)
 - Federal Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment installation



- Infrastructure Bill
 - \$110 billion for roads, bridges, and highways.
 - \$66 billion for rail infrastructure
 - \$65 billion for the electrical grid
 - \$65 billion for broadband internet
 - \$55 billion for drinking water infrastructure
 - \$50 billion for environmental resiliency and western water infrastructure
 - \$39.9 billion for public transit



- Infrastructure Bill (cont'd)
 - \$21 billion in environmental remediation
 - \$17 billion for ports
 - \$11 billion for transportation safety
 - \$7.5 billion for electric vehicle charging stations
 - \$7.5 billion for electric ferries and buses
 - \$5 billion for electric school buses
 - \$1 billion to reconnect communities divided by transportation infrastructure, including design, demolition, and reconstruction of street grids, parks, and other infrastructure



Reconciliation Bill

- Taxes
 - Avg. top tax rate on personal income would reach 57.4 percent
 - Highest rate in the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD)
 - All 50 states would have top tax rates on personal income exceeding 50 percent
 - Top-personal-income-tax-rates-by-state-under-Build-Back-Betterframework.png (1355×1167) (taxfoundation.org)
 - Negates the 199A deduction



Reconciliation Bill (cont'd)

- Labor Provisions Clean Energy/Energy Efficiency Projects
 - Davis-Bacon/Prevailing Wage Requirements
 - Registered Apprenticeship Requirements
 - Percentage of total labor hours
 - ▶ 5% in 2022
 - ▶ 10% in 2023
 - ▶ 15% 2024
 - ▶ If 4 laborers, 1 must be a registered apprentice
- OSHA Penalties
 - Willful and repeated violations not less than \$5,000 per violation but not more than \$70,000 per violations; and
 - Serious and non-serious violations not more than \$7,000 per violation.



- House vote this week?
 - OMB Score
- Senate uncertainty Manchin, Sinema
- Byrd Rule
 - Senate parliamentarian
 - Prohibits provisions that are viewed as "extraneous" to the budget.
 - Prevents a reconciliation bill from containing nonbudgetary provisions



- COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS)
 - 100 or more employees
 - Employees to be fully vaccinated or be regularly tested starting Jan. 4
 - 5th Circuit Court Continues Stay
 - Orders OSHA to "take no steps to implement or enforce the Mandate until further court order."
 - Employers now have no obligations under the ETS and are not likely to have any for at least the next two weeks
 - 6th Circuit won "Lottery" where all petitions will be consolidated
 - IEC requests to join ABC petition in 11th Circuit
